Subject: Log Scaler's Licensure Requirements

On May 19, 2017 Acting Governor Bread Little signed Executive Order No. 2017-06, titled

ON REVIEWING THE NECESSITY FOR AND THE APPLICABILITY AND PROCESSING OF LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS FOR INDIVIDUALS ENGAGED OR DESIRING TO BE ENGAGED OR EMPLOYED IN TECHNICAL, PROFESSIONAL OR OTHER OCCUPATIONS WITHIN THE STATE OF IDAHO, EMPHASIZING THE EFFECT OF LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS ON IDAHO EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

A copy of this order is attached as required by this Executive Order, the Scaling Board will be reviewing all requirements pertaining to scaler licensing including but not limited to temporary permits, apprenticeship certificates, license renewals, fees, and disciplinary actions. The Board will be looking for ways to improve the process or eliminate any unnecessary requirements.

Box 83720, Boise, ID. 83720. The information may be submitted either in writing or electronically to stibsp@ibsp.idaho.gov no later than May 1, 2018.

The Idaho Board of Scaling Practices will hold a Board meeting in May, 2018 to review current licensure requirements and take into consideration any and all comments submitted. The Board will submit a report to the Governors' office detailing their assessment and recommendations by July 1, 2018.
